HOW TO RENEW OR GET A DOG LICENSE

- Dogs seven months or older require a license.
- Resident must bring a rabies certificate, valid through October 31 of the licensing year.
- If the dog has been spayed or neutered, the owner must provide proof.

The dog license is required to be renewed every January. It is the responsibility of the owner to register, and a reminder is not sent out. The fee is \$12.00 for a neutered/spayed dog and \$15.00 for non-neutered/spayed. There is a late fee of \$5 after February 1st. North Hanover does not require the licensing of cats.

North Hanover's free rabies clinic will be held on January 16, 2016, 9 am to 11 am. All dogs and cats are welcome.



We take this opportunity to remind you this is in accordance with State Law and Township Ordinance 6-020.1, No person shall keep or harbor any dog of licensing age within the Township without first obtaining a license therefore to be issued by the Township Clerk, upon application by the owner and payment of the prescribed fee. •

ATTENTION HOMEOWNERS

In an attempt to improve Emergency Services for our community, we ask that your house be identified clearly. Please use a number at your driveway access no less than 3 inches tall.

This is in accordance with Township Ordinance 8-040: Numbering of house/buildings shall be required to be clearly displayed and visible from public streets for all properties within the Township of North Hanover. This requirement is to assist the general public or authorities in identifying any property in the event of an emergency, as well as for the welfare of the general public, pursuant to NJSA 40:67.1 (j)

CLEAN-UP DAY—8AM-NOON—OCTOBER 3

With our annual fall clean-up day coming soon, now is the time to think about the household items you'd like to dispose of that are not ordinarily accepted at the waste facility.

There will be on site **paper shredding of personal documents, electronics recycling** accepting TVs, computers, monitors, CD/VCR/DVD players, and small household electronics. **Household hazardous waste** disposal includes: paints, fluorescent light bulbs and any chemicals you can use in your home, on your car, or on your lawn.

Bulky items may be brought to Meany Road waste facility on Saturday, October 3, **OR** pay \$5.00 (per item) for a sticker before Thursday, October 1 to have the township pick up at the end of your driveway on Friday, October 2. The items must be out by Thursday night for Friday morning pick up. The item must be a bulky item such as furniture, not transportable in your car. Stickers may be purchased at the municipal building. **NO HOUSEHOLD TRASH** will be picked up.

As noted in the last newsletter, the township committee has been working for several years developing a fiscally sound road improvement plan. As do all municipalities, North Hanover Township has appropriated tax dollars year after year for road repairs, this is required for safety and welfare within our community. Like all maintained infrastructure, each has a useful life. When the cost of maintaining/repairing the infrastructure no longer extends its useful life it is time to implement a capital plan where the money invested returns the infrastructure to a place where maintaining is routine and repair is seldom required. Owning and

maintaining a personal car is a similar comparison.

So what will you see over the next two years? With an expected bid acceptance in November the timeline for the project will begin. Every road owned by the township will be paved. The roads will be grouped into phases to provide a cost effective logical progression.

Entering into this project now with the current reduced oil pricing will ensure maximum road coverage at the best rate. Residents will be notified before your street becomes an active part of the resurfacing project.

It brings us pleasure to inform NHT residents that the road ahead will be smoother, literally. •
