**PUBLIC COMMENT**

**OPEN PUBLIC COMMENT**

Agnes Marsala – Chesterfield Township Resident – Ms. Marsala urged the Township Committee and all Governing bodies affected to oppose the pipeline in totality. Ms. Marsala expressed various concerns regarding the Pipeline. Mayor Durr informed Ms. Marsala of various meetings

with officials regarding the Pipeline and stated it was prudent for the Township Committee to address the needs of the residents.

Lisa Young – Streeker Road – Ms. Young calls for the Governing Body not to throw in the “towel” yet and discussed her meeting attendance regarding the Pipeline. Mayor Durr stated by no means was the Governing Body throwing in the “towel”. Mayor Durr also noted the project schedule has been delayed.

Martha Vasalka – Chesterfield Township Resident – Ms. Vasalka expressed various concerns regarding the Pipeline. Ms. Vasalka discussed her attendance at the “Food/Water watch”. Mayor Durr stated North Hanover Township is well represented legally and informed Ms. Vasalka that Chesterfield Township sold the land for the Pipeline and Ms. Vasalka stated she was aware. Mayor Durr thanked Ms. Vasalka for her participation.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Township Committee of the Township of North Hanover, County of Burlington, State of New Jersey, that it does hereby oppose the construction of this facility and further urges the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection Agency to consider the negative impact that the proposed hazardous “thermal oxidizer” facility would have on the residents of Burlington County; and

- iii. Adopts and approves the FUND's Bylaws.
